#### 1 Introduction

As stated in the DOW this deliverable (D5.5) describes the final contribution of WP 5 to the BNCI Horizon 2020 roadmap (D1.4). The contributions of WP 5 regarding the roadmap are more supporting actions such the organization of the BNCI Horizon 2020 retreat in Hallstatt, dissemination of draft versions of the roadmap and eliciting feedback on these draft versions. WP 5 did not contribute to the actual content of the roadmap.

#### 2 BNCI Horizon 2020 retreat in Hallstatt

One of the main events of the BNCI Horizon 2020 project is the retreat, in which the foundation for the roadmap was established.

The key element in the retreat was the focus sessions on the six topics of the roadmap: Replace, Restore, Enhance, Improve, Supplement and Research. In these focus sessions the basis for the roadmap was defined.

## 4 Establishing the BCI society

The launch of a formal Brain-Computer Interface Society has taken place on March 13, 2015. The Society has its basis in the Netherlands (Utrecht) but operates internationally. The Board consists of 9 members, and can expand to a maximum of 12. Three officers have been chosen by majority vote. The bylaws have been made up in Dutch and in English, and are deposited with the Dutch Chamber of Commerce. This BCI society should play an important role in preserving and extending the legacy, including the roadmap, of the BNCI Horizon 2020 project.
